1. Log into your PowerSchool account at <https://www.cbmcumrdo.ca/powerschool>.
2. Scroll to the bottom and click SchoolEngage on the left-hand side.
3. A new tab will open – look for "Incomplete Re-enrollment Form 2025-2026".
4. Click on the form and review each page, updating any necessary information.
5. On the final page, type your name in the signature box and hit Submit.



In fact, when we examine case studies involving students who did not meet the requirements for graduation, attendance is always a part of that story.

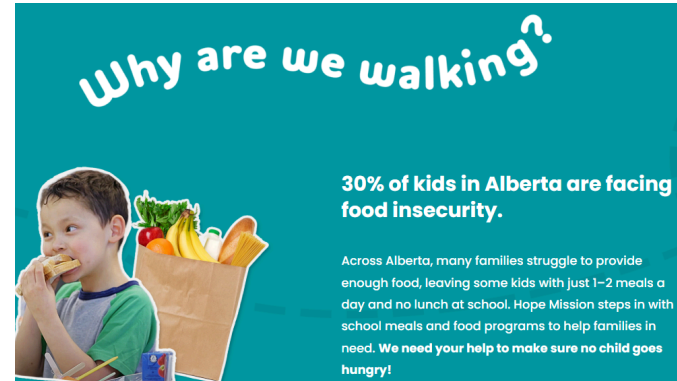
While we understand that occasional absences are sometimes unavoidable, it's important to monitor attendance closely. According to WRPS policy, if a student's attendance drops below 90% (or they are absent for more than 10% of school days), the school is required to follow up, and caregivers are provided written notification. We know that this follow-up is key in supporting students in regular attendance at school.

Whether it's illness, appointments, or family circumstances, we ask that parents and guardians please keep us informed at any time a student will be away. The easiest and most efficient way to notify the school is through email, or calling the office directly.

Every day in school counts. Let's work together to ensure all students have the opportunity to thrive by making attendance a top priority.
